Application of regional ERDF funds for encouraging innovation procurement.

More than 8,000 contracting authorities at national, regional and local level

Spanish public procurement system is decentralised. There is no central procurement office.

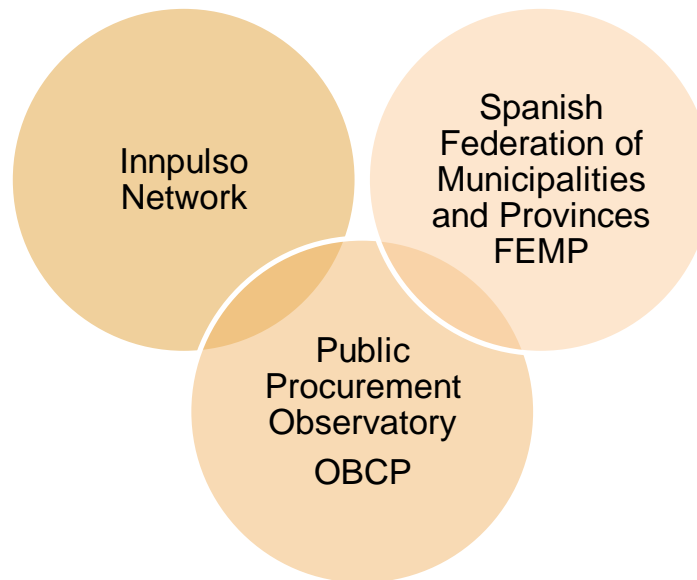


EXISTING RELATED NETWORKS IN SPAIN

INNPULSO: Formed by 68 cities and town halls in Spain for general innovation aims, offers some consultancy services to those municipalities for coaching them to define their IP needs.

OBCP: meeting place for professionals in the field. Promotion of Innovation Procurement is one of their main activities.

FEMP: Spanish association of local entities that groups municipalities, provincial councils and island councils, totaling 7,364 entities.:

CONCLUSIONS

- Innovation procurement was strongly promoted in 2011 and 2012 in Spain, but since a mandatory spending target was not established, the instrument is underused.
- Current support instruments use almost entirely European funds.
- There is an absence of a structured innovation procurement policy for the country not using ERDF funds: lack of action plan, monitoring system, financial incentives and capacity building.





CONCLUSIONS

- Even so, Spain is one of the European countries where innovation procurement is more developed and there are interesting success cases, mainly in Galicia, Catalonia and Andalusia.
- The exchange of good practices with other European countries can be very helpful for the strategic support service in the drafting and implementation of medium-term strategies and action plans for the entire country.
